IMPORTANT DATE CHANGE:

Beginning **May 1st**, we can sign your application for licensure indicating that you have graduated. This has changed since the previous mailing.

Score Transfer

The state you choose to be your state of original licensure is important. Currently, if you wish to practice in another state you must reciprocate off that original license. Unless the laws change, you should keep that original license active forever.

Example

Assume you were to license in Idaho and later wish to practice in Nebraska. You would apply through NABP and take a law exam for Nebraska (and pay a bunch of fees). To reciprocate you must demonstrate to NABP that you are licensed in the state of your original licensure. After a few years, you might be tempted to drop your Idaho license. Doing so will cause problems if you ever wish to practice in another state. If you drop your original licensure, you could continue to practice in Nebraska but would not be able to reciprocate to another state. Your Nebraska license is not your original license and is not valid for reciprocation.

When you take the NAPLEX you may register for more than one state by paying a score-transfer fee. For some students, this may be a good idea. If you wish to complete a residency or practice in another state for a few years before returning to your home state, you might wish to register in both states at the same time. This is much less than the cost of reciprocation. It costs an additional \$75 to score transfer. There will be additional license and other state fees depending upon the state.
