Student Body

As a public institution, the mission of the College's traditional Doctor of Pharmacy program is to foster the profession of pharmacy and meet the needs of the citizens of the state of Idaho. As a result, approximately 80% of each entering class is comprised of Idaho residents.

Three Instructional Sites

The sites are located in Meridian, Idaho (near Boise), Pocatello, Idaho, and Anchorage, Alaska.

PharmD Admissions

Prepharmacy coursework must be completed by the end of the spring term of the year the applicant is applying for admission. The online application deadline is February 1. Application materials include: a \$55 application fee, official transcript(s) and three completed recommendation forms, one being from a registered pharmacist.

Applicants are strongly encouraged to obtain pharmacy experience prior to applying for admissions to the PharmD program. Pharmacy experience may be gained through shadowing, volunteering, or working in a pharmacy setting.

Fourth Year Clinical Rotations

Advanced Pharmacy Practice Experiences (APPE) are under the close supervision of well qualified preceptors at sites located throughout Idaho, Nevada, and Alaska. Students build on the skills and knowledge obtained in the previous three years of the pharmacy curriculum and have the opportunity to serve a wide variety of patient populations in various practice setting.

Residencies

Approximately 20% of the sixty-nine 2017 PharmD graduates are completing residencies or fellowships. ISU graduates are highly competitive nationally.

Employment

ISU PharmD graduates are sought after for various career opportunities. New graduates reported employment in the following areas (in order of majority of positions accepted): community pharmacy practice, clinics and hospital practice, long-term care, and home health care.

Scholarships

The College of Pharmacy awarded over \$200,000 to Doctor of Pharmacy students in 2016-17. Many scholarships are made available through the generosity of alumni and donors.
